Don't forget that any in-person events/gatherings still need approval by the State Office. At this time, clubs and groups can meet with 10 or less people if in the same room/small area. Clubs/groups can also meet in "pods". This means that you can have groups of 10 or less meet in a location outdoors if more than 20 feet can be maintained between each pod with a maximum of 5 total pods. Meeting Ideas

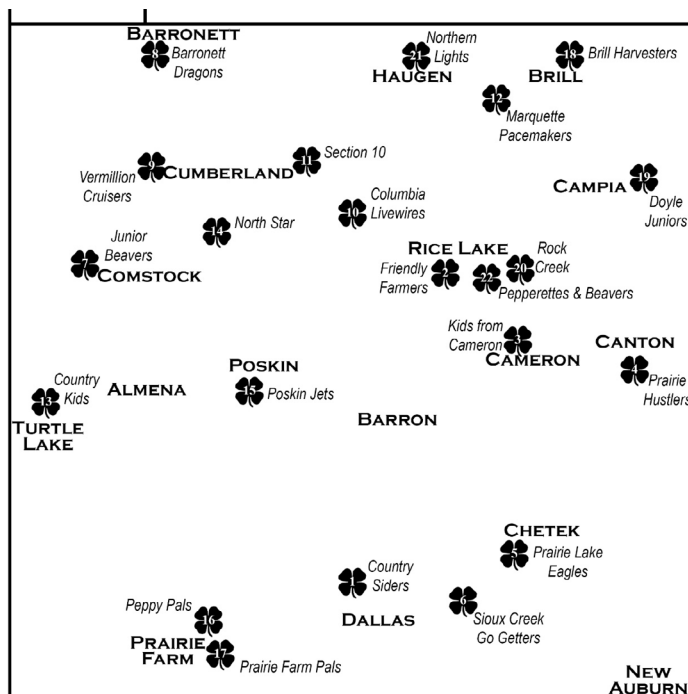
1. Host a virtual meeting, members without internet will hopefully have phone reception so they can call in (**note you need access to a pro-zoom account or pro-Google account. Someone in your club might have one, or consider purchasing one).
 2. Hold project meetings instead of business meetings. This would allow smaller groups to come together to work on a common project.
 3. Hold a hybrid meeting. Have a virtual option and an in-person meeting. Just remember you need program approval to meet in person in groups of 10 or less.
 4. Host a Zoom meeting and designate one family to lead an educational part of your meeting.
 5. Conduct a meeting using social media, or an app (like Goosechase) – you can come up with a creative way to keep everyone connected.
 6. Use YouTube to record project lessons or do demonstrations, then your club can watch them on their own.
 7. Deliver brownie mixes to everyone in your club, bake them in your household and then share them over Zoom or Google Meets (or another platform).
 8. Participate in a state or national project together as a club. You could use 4-H Week events to get on zoom and see each other.
 9. Call each other or mail a letter. Like we used to do!
 10. Suggest an idea and try it out (it’s ok to fail!)
- What are your ideas? If you’ve had a successful meeting, let’s hear it and share your ideas with others.
